She has **published** a number of important papers in a medical journal. A new book is **published** every 13 minutes in America. What do you think 'publish' means? Brian Sewell, who was described as Britain's most famous art critic, has died aged 84. Though many artists say that they don't care what art critics say or write about them, they must care a little. What do you think 'art critic' means? Sometimes when we look at a piece of art we understand it. Its meaning is clear to us. I thought about the **meaning** of the work of art for a long time. What do you think 'meaning' means? _____ The **sculpture** La Pieta by Michelangelo shows Mary holding Jesus in her arms. The **sculpture** was six feet tall and stood in the dining room. What do you think 'sculpture' means? **Traditional crafts** are sold to tourists in the local markets. Parents teach their children how to make traditional crafts. What do you think 'traditional crafts' means? These images are still recognized as **fine art** and are highly collectable. An example of **fine art** is a Picasso painting. What do you think 'fine art' means? A woman holding her baby is the **subject matter** of the painting. New artists sometimes find it hard to choose the right **subject matter** to paint.
